The Vernon Parish Police Jury met in Regular Session, Monday, April 15, 2024 at 10 a.m. in the Police Jury meeting room with the following members **PRESENT**: James B. "Jim" Tuck – President, Douglas "Doug" Roshong, Cody Hostetler, Scottie Benjamin, Charnel Bailey, Malcolm "Dean" Mitchell, David Brister, Curtis Clay – Vice President, Steven "Quintin" Thompson, and Kenny Haymon. The following members were **ABSENT**: Marvin Hilton and Alton "David" Fox.

The Vernon Parish Police Jury was convened as the governing authority of the Parish of Vernon, by Mr. James B. "Jim" Tuck, President, and was then ready for the business on the agenda.

The invocation was given by Mr. Kenny Haymon and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Doug Roshong.

Mrs. Beth Wilcox was present at the meeting to execute the proclamation, along with Mr. Tuck and Mrs. Plummer, declaring April Child Abuse Prevention Month in Vernon Parish.

Mr. Joseph Gardner, Keeping It Country & Sons of AMVETS Veterans Tribute, was present at the meeting to discuss a festival they will be holding in March 2025 at the Vernon Parish Fairgrounds

Fire Chief Mike Laughlin, Anacoco, was present at the meeting to ask the jury to consider amending the current Fire District tax to allow for the funding of a dive team.

The President asked if there was any public comment on any agenda items; there was none.
